However, because of paucity of time, only Nursing Cadre could be deliberated. The Nursing Cadre re-structuring Agenda was briefed by Ptof. Amit Agarwal, Chief Medical Superintendent who presented that the existing strength was 1544 and the proposed strength is 3105, based on MCI norms for nurses and the requirement, i.e. creation of new Departments, Apex Trauma Centre and increasing number of beds etc. The Governing Body emphasized that it should be in conformity to the AIIMS pattern with presentation of the AIIMS norms on the ratio of nurses to beds. A comparative chart with AIIMS pattern should be presented in next GB.A pyramid on pattern of AIIMS, New Delhi should be prepared. Further, there should be a realistic assessment of numbers, especially with the current financial situation in the Govt. Also the Institute should decide the ratio of nursing services through outsourcing versus creation of regular posts, according to different clinical areas of the Institute. The outsourcing of services should be done at the lowest level. Further, the Governing Body directed that the existing promotional criteria of AIIMS should be followed by the Institute uniformly for all cadres. Action: Chief Medical Superintendant/Joint Director

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Dept. of Pediatric Endocrinology in AIIMS, New Delhi, and was informed that there is a Unit of Pediatric Endocrinology in the Dept. of Endocrinology, but that institutions like AIIMS and PGI Chandigarh were not under the purview of MCI.

After great deliberation, on a pattern similar to AIIMS, New Delhi, the GB approved the creation of a Unit of Pediatric Endocrinology in the Dept of Endocrinology in SGPGI with starting of a DM course in Pediatric Endocrinology. The GB agreed to the fulfillment of all the requirements as per MCI norms for starting a DM in Pediatric Endocrinology-beds, OPD space, Senior Residents positions, additional faculty positions etc. Common facilities and equipments could be shared with the parent Dept. of Endocrinology. It was also Directed by the GB, that for establishing a separate Dept of Pediatric Endocrinology, the Institute must first obtain detailed information about the Pediatric Endocrinology set up in premier Institutions like AIIMS, New Delhi, PGI Chandigarh and then make a presentation before the GB, for deliberation in the GB.

(d) Funds availability from appropriate head towards purchase of Reagents and Chemicals for Free of Cost Testing and Investigations to manage COVID-19 by Investigation Revolving Fund(IRF).

The GB was apprised that the Investigation Revolving Fund (IRF) was established on the principle of self-sustainability, whereby it purchased all the reagents, biologicals and consumables for various investigations done in the Institute and received back funds from the payment done for the individual investigations by patients. The investigations are charged on the basis of their actual cost with an additional nominal overhead cost, although, IRF receives only 50% of investigation charges

However, in the case of Covid patients admitted in the Rajdhani Covid Hospital, all investigations (Covid testing and others) as per Govt. Order were done free of cost and thus IRF though had provided all the reagents and consumables, but in turn is not receiving funds accordingly.

The same had happened in the case of Hospital Revolving Fund (HRF), which had provided drugs and consumables free of cost in the management of COVID patients, but in turn had received no funds.

These issues were deliberated in the95th Finance Committee Meeting of the Institute held on 21.08.2020, and agreed upon in principle that the reimbursement of expenditure incurred in Covid-19 patients w.e.f. starting of

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RCH, would be from Institute budget with the condition that IRF/HRF will only claim the expenditure actually incurred on Covid patients which will be examined by the Hospital Accounts.

The GB directed that a clear proposal should be prepared on number of COVID patients treated, the expenditure incurred by HRF and IRF on them, with no overlap with the expenditure met by Govt. /Institute on their management and with omission of the extra 10% surcharge in case of HRF. The statement can be put before the next GB for appraisal, after making payments on actual basis.

(e) Approval of Procedure
adopted for Medical Gas Pipe
Line work at Rajdhani Covid
Hospital of the Institute.

The GB was informed that during the Covid-19 pandemic the Institute was directed by the Govt. of U.P, to convert the Apex Trauma Center into the Rajdhani Covid Hospital (RCH). This necessitated in carrying out the medical gas pipe line work for providing oxygen and vacuum supply on all beds and ventilator facility on 80 beds in the RCH on most urgent basis. The Institute had an Agreement with a vendor (Ms Indian Traders) for gas pipe line work, but the Agreement had expired on 28.02.2020, and the vendor was unable to work further on the basis of the Agreement due to non-availability of material during the lockdown period. Accordingly under the emergency situation the work was undertaken from two firms (M/s Unissi India Pvt Ltd, ND and M/s Expert Engineers, Lucknow), with whom the material was available, with the condition that the work will be executed on lowest rate received from etender or rates obtained from these two firms. The balance work will be done from the firm eligible through e-tender. The work done from these two firms was of approximately Rs 17 Lakhs.

The GB directed that procurement to be done in accordance with the GO from Rajasav Vibhag (Revenue Dept), No 714/1-11-2020-Ra.-11, dt 23.08.2020, Govt of U.P, with full justification. Further, documents for price justification should also be obtained and the work should be verified by a Govt. organization like PWD. Thereafter, the proposal should be submitted to the Govt., for approval of the purchase procedure due to the extraordinary circumstances.

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

However, GB directed that assessment of the moral and ethical behavior of Nursing staff should be done as part of the written examination of selection. However, the Institute for promotions of Faculty members (Assistant Professor to Associate Professor, Associate Professor to Additional Professor & Additional Professor to Professor) for the years 2018 &2019 also decided to make it mandatory for the Faculty members to fulfill the MCI norms for research publications, since non-fulfillment of MCI norms was leading to MCI not recognizing faculty

After deliberation the Governing Body directed that the Teacher Eligibility Qualification (TEQ) norms as notified by MCI from time to time should be made compulsory for assessment promotions of faculty members of the Institute on the posts of Associate Professor, Additional Professor and Professor, but at no time the norms would be inferior to that of AIIMS, New Delhi. Further, since currently the MCI TEQ norms are from Associate Professor to Additional Prof/Professor, hence Institute would adopt same norms for both promotions from Associate to Additional Prof and from Additional Prof to Professor, till such time that NMC, in supersession of MCI, makes separate norms from Additional Professor to Professor.

Permission of the Governing Body was sought to permit hiring outsourced Paramedical Services, through GeM portal- for six additional Hospital areas, namely—Apex Trauma Center now converted to Rajdhani Covid Hospital, Liver Transplantation Unit, New Hematology wards and Bone Marrow Transplantation Unit, 134 beds wards in Old OPD area, Post op ICU (additional 10 beds) and Swine Flu ward (11 beds), along with similar services being hired in main SGPGI Hospital. The GB deliberated and pointed out that since it is outsourcing of paramedical services, hence in the Agenda, instead of numbers of the services needed, it should have been mentioned as units. It was emphasized that outsourced manpower or services should not be taken against sanctioned vacant posts, as this may be legally challenged. The GB was apprised that the selection on regular posts through advertisement is in process. After deliberations, it was decided that currently the ongoing contracts for outsourcing of paramedical services for the six additional hospital areas are being extended until 31.12.2020. This may be brought to the notice of Govt. and approval sought. After 31.12.2020 these services will have to be catered to, either by regular appointments against vacant sanctioned posts, or new service contracts based on service level agreements processed through the GeM portal. The services to be taken via the GeM portal shall be strictly for maintaining essential patient care work, and units will be based on workload &nature of services required in various clinical areas, and not against and neither in proportion to sanctioned posts. It was directed that these services must be hired through GeM Portal, ensuring there are no violations of any Government Order and Orders of Hon'ble
