4.04-A	Nursing Cadre: Proposal for restructuring of nursing cadre was discussed at length. Prof. Gaurav Agarwal, CMS apprised the Governing Body of the methodology adopted for formulation of nursing cadre, and calculation of the number of posts in this cadre, as per instructions from the 91 st GB. He informed that as per information received from AIIMS New Delhi, the Staff Inspection Unit (SIU) norms are followed by them for determination of needs for nursing personnel. The same norms have been perused by SGPGIMS team to calculate the numbers, and detailed calculations and the proposal of restructured nursing cadre thus derived were presented. An alternative cadre structure based on the actual demands and justifications provided by the nursing staff association of SGPGIMS was also presented for consideration of the GB.	The GB observed that the overall numbers of nursing personnel proposed by SGPGIMS is justified and acceptable. However, it was decided that the institute must ensure that: 1. The overall pyramidal system of nursing cadre followed by AIIMS must be maintained, i.e. the relative numbers of nurses in various levels from entry to senior most are in same proportions as they exist at AIIMS/ reflected in SIU calculations. 2. A reasonable number of nursing services may also be procured on outsourced basis at the entry level to ensure maintenance of nursing services in needs of exigencies. 3. The distribution of the various levels of nursing cadre needs to be rationalized as per SIU/AIIMS.

4. Need for nurses for the upcoming 500 -bedded Emergency and Renal Transplant Centre at SGPGIMS would be met from the proposed nursing cadre. 4. Action: CMS Hospital Attendants: The proposal of restructured cadre of hospital attendants was discussed next.
